PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

2024 at RPS is going to be a very busy year for us all. This week's newsletter will inform our school community of important updates, upgrades, changes to school-based procedures and planning of major events for the remainder of 2024. It is important that our school community are aware of what is happening in their school.

1. Website Upgrade - Term 2: New website due to be released by commencement of Term 3. There will be no disruption to our current website until the day in which our new website is uploaded to replace our current website (one day only).

2. School Staff Intranet - as our school continues to expand so is the need for our management systems to be improved for our staff. The intranet will allow staff to have access to all school documentation in an easy and efficient manner. This will reduce time spent looking at different platforms to access documents, programs, and other administrative tasks.

3. School Compliance Assessment - Term 3: Audit process and evidence due 12/8/24. All current school policies will be updated with the latest department templates. During Term 2, we will start to remove all policies from our website and upload new policies once they are approved. The compliance assessment focuses heavily on Child Safe Standards, Policies, Procedures in schools, VRQA Victoria Register Quality Assurance (DE) Policies, medical processes and procedures plus a range CONTINUED

of other compliance / accountability across the school. We have started this work and collecting the evidence required for the audit, this will continue to be a major focus for the remainder of Term 2 to ensure we are ready to submit our work/evidence by the due date, early Term 3.

4. School Review (every four years) – Term 4: The Review Panel includes the following people: School Reviewer, Senior Education Improvement Leader (SEIL) – regional representative, Tony Simpson, Principal, Members of Leadership Team/School Improvement Team (SIT), School Council President, Lyn Courtice, Challenge Principal Partners from other schools. Throughout the process and field days onsite, consultation will also involve teachers, ES staff, students and families (school council members). These groups will be interviewed by School Reviewer, SEIL and Challenge Partners. Whilst the review itself is conducted in Term 4, we have already started the work with our school teams to prepare for this event. We are currently receiving training for all school leaders to enable us to have a successful school review.

5. NAPLAN – Schools have received initial reports of the NAPLAN 2024 assessments – these reports are modified and provide school staff to commence data analysis for future planning. Complete reports are due Mid to Late June. These will be forwarded to families shortly after that, which should be by end of Term 2.

6. Current enrolments: 479 plus 10 expressions of interest for enrolment this year. We are fast approaching 500 students!!

7. 2025 Foundation Enrolments are currently open. Please ensure you complete the enrolment forms, which can be sourced by either our website or office and submit / return them as quickly as possible. Enrolments are due by Friday 26th July, 2024 (end of Week 2 in Term 3). School tours for Foundation parents/carers are scheduled for:

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- Friday 17th May, 2024, 9:30-10:30am
- Friday 21st June, 2024, 9:30-10:30am

8. School Security – Gate entry/exits: We are due to have some works completed on the full intercom system installed on the first 2 entry gates from the carpark next Monday. The works include: Intercom (already installed), next stage: electronic opening gate and keypad entry for staff only. Please note that when the final works have been completed, our school gates will not open until 8:30am. Students can arrive at school from 8:30am where they can be supervised by duty staff. We are seeing many students being dropped off at very early times with no supervision. This is causing real concern from school staff for the safety of your children. We have Big Childcare available before and after school, please use this provider/service to always ensure your children are safe. Gates will be locked at 3:30pm – this ensures there are no people on school site that should not be there. We must ensure our students in after school care are safe when playing outside of the gym. Families will be asked to move on from 3:25pm. Please pick you children up on time, we finish at 3:15pm, not 3:30, 4:00 or 5pm!

9. School Grounds Safety: ball games will be banned before and after school. These games are becoming very unsafe for our families and children who arrive at school and when leaving school. Therefore, the only time sports games with balls will be during formal school breaks during the day. Please respect the safety of each other.

10. Inclusion Outreach Coach (IOC): The department are rolling out an initiative called the 'Outreach Inclusion Coach' Program. We are fortunate to be selected to be part of this program. Debbie Demark is the coach who will work with RPS each Wednesday until the end of Term 3. Her role is supporting growth of your children in their overall learning and wellbeing. The IOC has expertise in inclusive practices, problem solving, a deep knowledge of teaching and learning plus

the skills to coach and support all members of the school, and to enhance RPS inclusive practice capability to improve student outcomes.

11. Disability & Inclusion Program (DIP) – Profiler Meetings / SSG: Our DIP team are progressing well in the rollout of D&I. Training is still being provided as this is a very big reform for schools to implement and manage. During Term 2, some of our students and families will participate in 'Profiler' meetings for the purposes of securing funding to support their child at school. Student Support Group (SSGs) will continue to be scheduled in the middle weeks of each term.

12. NDIS Providers Policy: The department has created a new policy and updated procedures for how schools manage NDIS providers on school visits to meet with their clients. We will be sending home a separate letter to our families to advise of the processes all Victorian Government schools need to implement. With consultation with School Council, our school, in conjunction with NDIS providers, will sign a 'Licence Agreement' to meet the legal requirements of DE.

14. 3/4 Camp Program: Wednesday 29th May – 31st May, 2024

15. Formal report writing term: - Reports will be generated through Compass for the first time this semester. Families will have reports in the last week of term.

As you can see, we are working hard at RPS to ensure we are providing the best education we can for your children.



A WORD FROM WELLBEING with Ms Merida West

As a school, we often discuss bullying with students and parents. Please read the below regarding Bullying (taken from <u>www.kidshelpline.com.au</u>).

What is Bullying?

Sometimes, people get confused about what is and isn't bullying. People can think that someone saying something they don't like is bullying – but it's not. Bullying is different from conflict or unkindness. Bullying is mean, but being mean doesn't always mean bullying.

Bullying behaviours:

 Are aggressive, unkind or mean behaviours Are repeated behaviours (it must happen multiple times, in an ongoing way to be defined as bullying) Happen on purpose Must have a power imbalance - which means that people bullying and the people being bullied aren't seen as being 'equal', e.g. older, bigger people picking on smaller, younger people, or 'popular' people targeting someone who they see as being 'unpopular', or who is struggling to make friends.

Bullying is not the same as:

 Being rude – saying or doing something hurtful that wasn't planned or meant to hurt someone, e.g. someone pushing in front of you in the canteen line Being mean – doing something hurtful to someone on purpose once or twice, e.g. a friend refusing to play with you one day Conflict – having a disagreement with a friend, e.g. two friends getting into an argument and saying mean things to each other Respectful feedback on behaviours you're doing that aren't ok, e.g. "It's not ok roll your eyes every time they talk about sport." •A friend putting in a 'boundary' e.g. "I don't like it when you keep telling me what to do." Natural consequences in socialising, e.g. a friend not trusting you because you shared their secret



LEARNING AUSLAN with Mr Stille

"RABBIT"



With pointer and middle fingers of both hands extended and pointing upwards, thumbs extended and touching temples, bend fingers forward twice quickly.

"CHICKEN"

Bring pinched fingers in front of mouth and open and close, like a bird's beak





"PIG"

Move fist, with thumb towards nose, in a small circle around nose.

"COW"

With fists at temples move hands outwards and upwards in an arc.





NUMERACY with Mrs Lehan

Addition and Subtraction

The main topic that students in Years 1–6 are focusing on this term is 'Addition and Subtraction' whilst Foundation students are still learning about numbers and counting. A lot of our teaching is focusing on using various mental (in the mind) strategies and materials (such as counters, number lines etc) to work with numbers and explaining how students got answers to problems.

Here is a general breakdown of how we teach students to add and subtract:

Stage 1 = Counting everything to find the total and moving objects away to subtract

Stage 2 = Counting on from a number eg: 5 + 3, I keep the 5 in my mind and count 3 more, 6,7,8

Stage 3= Facts to 5: knowing that 2 and 3 make 5, 4 and 1 make 5, 5 and 0 make 5, 1 and 4 makes 5. Knowing that 4 is one less than 5 and 5 is one less than 6. 5 is one more than 4. Facts to 10: 3 and 7 make 10, 2 and 8 make ten, 7 is three less than 10. (students are working at this stage in Foundation, years 1-2)

Stage 4= Bridging ten: knowing my tens facts helps me bridge (add past ten)- To add 7 and 5, I know that 3 more makes 10 then I add the other 2 (so I have to know that I can split the 5 into 3 and 2). (years 1-2)

Stage 5= Doubles and near doubles. I know that double 6 is 12 so I know 6+6 is 12. If I know this I can also add 6+7 because double 6 is 12 and 1 more makes 13. (years 1-3)


Stage 6= Extend on tens facts. If I know 6 and 7 is 13, I can work out that 16 + 17 is 33 because I can add the tens and add the ones. If I know 6 and 7 is 13, I also know that 60 + 70 is 130, 600+700 is 1300. (years 2-4)

Once students know the above facts and can do them mentally (in their mind) and not counting on their fingers, they have the basics to be successful in more difficult calculations. For students to succeed in later years of schooling, it's important that they have mastered these basic skills. **Please look check Class Dojo for some tips/activities you can do at home.**


