### **CONTINUATION OF PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE**

We would like to acknowledge and thank all 2023 members who are no longer serving on our School Council, your input and dedication to our school is valued. We look forward to working together in decision making, as we continue to focus on whole school improvements such as providing the best and most current education for our students and enhancing all areas across our school, including grounds improvements.

Our meeting opened with our two School Captains, Jackson Courtice and Lilah Galea, making a presentation to our S.C. Members. We were very proud of our student leaders and this practice will continue in one of the two meetings we have each term. Well done!

You will notice that our school now has three intercom devices on three of the four entry gates from carpark. The work has not been completely finalised yet. We have electronic gate opening and keypads to be installed as well. This will mean that Office staff will no longer have to physically open and shut gates all day long. We are very happy to know our school will be completely secure when all gates are locked from 9am until 3:10pm.

### **ATTENDANCE MATTERS**

#### HELP YOUR CHILD SUCCEED IN SCHOOL: BUILD THE HABIT OF GOOD ATTENDANCE EARLY SCHOOL SUCCESS GOES HAND IN HAND WITH GOOD ATTENDANCE!

#### Did you know?

- Starting in kindergarten, too many absences can cause children to fall behind in school
- Missing 10 percent (or about 18 days) can make it harder to learn to read
- Students can still fall behind if they miss just a day or two days every few weeks
  - Being late to school may lead to poor attendance
- Absences can affect the whole classroom if the teacher has to slow down learning to help children catch up

Attending school regularly helps children feel better about school—and themselves. Start building this habit in preschool so they learn right away that going to school on time, every day is important.

Good attendance will help children do well in high school, tertiary education and at work

#### What you can do

• Set a regular bed time and morning routine

- Lay out clothes and pack backpacks the night before
- Find out what day school starts and make sure your child has the required shots

 Introduce your child to teachers and classmates before school starts to help transition

• Don't let your child stay home unless they are truly sick

- Keep in mind complaints of a stomach ache or headache can be a sign of anxiety and not a reason to stay home
- If your child seems anxious about going to school, talk to teachers, school counsellors, or other parents for advice on how to make her feel comfortable and excited about learning
- Develop back-up plans for getting to school if something comes up. Call on a family member, a neighbour, or another parent
  - Avoid medical appointments and extended trips when school is in session

### A WORD FROM WELLBEING with Ms Merida West

#### Keeping students safe at Rockbank Primary School.

Before school we have a number of staff supporting students from 8.30am. Students are not allowed to be dropped off prior to 8.30.

The dojo shop is open every morning for a quick snack for students that may not have had enough breakfast.

There are staff at the front of the school helping with traffic flow and welcoming students to school.

There is also a staff member at the front of the school and rear of the school from 8.30 – 9am.

During break times, there are staff members supervising students in all the different areas. We also have activities for students to participate in such as skipping, chess, gardening, art club, chalk drawing, listening to music and table tennis.

After school, staff collect all the students from the rear of the yard and take them out the front. Again, staff are at the front of the school ensuring the safety of students. Students are supervised outside until 3.30. Parents/Guardians are contacted if students are not collected by this time.





### LEARNING AUSLAN with Mr Stiller

### "RED"

With pointer finger extended from fist, pointing upwards; form a small circle over lower lip with fingertip.





### "BLUE"

Rub back of wrist back and forth with fingertips twice.

### "YELLOW"

With pointer finger and thumb touching at tips, other fingers spread, place hand at temple and swivel hand forward twice.





### "GREEN"

Start with hand flat, blade of little finger resting on wrist of other hand. Slide blade of little finger along arm to elbow.



### NUMERACY with Mrs Lehan

#### **Addition and Subtraction**

The main topic that students in Years 1–6 are focusing on this term is 'Addition and Subtraction' whilst Foundation students are still learning about numbers and counting. A lot of our teaching is focusing on using various mental (in the mind) strategies and materials (such as counters, number lines etc) to work with numbers and explaining how students got answers to problems.

Here is a general breakdown of how we teach students to add and subtract:

**Stage 1 =** Counting everything to find the total and moving objects away to subtract

### **Stage 2 =** Counting on from a number eg: 5 + 3, I keep the 5 in my mind and count 3 more, 6,7,8

Stage 3= Facts to 5: knowing that 2 and 3 make 5, 4 and 1 make 5, 5 and 0 make 5, 1 and 4 makes 5. Knowing that 4 is one less than 5 and 5 is one less than 6. 5 is one more than 4. Facts to 10: 3 and 7 make 10, 2 and 8 make ten, 7 is three less than 10. (students are working at this stage in Foundation, years 1-2)

**Stage 4=** Bridging ten: knowing my tens facts helps me bridge (add past ten)- To add 7 and 5, I know that 3 more makes 10 then I add the other 2 (so I have to know that I can split the 5 into 3 and 2). (years 1-2)

**Stage 5=** Doubles and near doubles. I know that double 6 is 12 so I know 6+6 is 12. If I know this I can also add 6+7 because double 6 is 12 and 1 more makes 13. (years 1-3)

Stage 6= Extend on tens facts. If I know 6 and 7 is 13, I can work out that 16 + 17 is 33 because I can add the tens and add the ones. If I know 6 and 7 is 13, I also know that 60 + 70 is 130, 600+700 is 1300. (years 2-4)

Once students know the above facts and can do them mentally (in their mind) and not counting on their fingers, they have the basics to be successful in more difficult calculations. For students to succeed in later years of schooling, it's important that they have mastered these basic skills. **Please look check Class Dojo for some tips/activities you can do at home.**
